



G(irls)20 Reveals 2014 Delegates

Scalable solutions to global challenges to be provided to G20 Leaders

Toronto, ON, Canada – March 7, 2014 - - Designed according to G20 architecture, G(irls)20 brings together one female delegate from each G20 country, plus a representative from the European and African Unions, Afghanistan, Pakistan and the MENA region. The young women will debate and design solutions that will *economically* advance girls and women around the world. These solutions will be prepared in the form of a communiqué and presented to G20 Leaders for their consideration.

After the Summit, delegates return to their home country and put their ideas into action by designing and executing their own initiative or partnering with another enterprise in the social profit sector, academic or private sector. Examples of delegate activity can be found [here](#).

The fifth Official Summit will take place in Sydney, Australia from August 25th – 28th. Previous Summits include: Canada, 2010; France, 2011; Mexico, 2012 and Russia, 2013. Prior to each Official Summit, delegates are immersed in 3 days of workshop training provided by private sector and social profit partners.

Through an open global application process, any girl between the ages of 18-20, from a G20 member country, European and African Union was encouraged to apply. This year, G(irls)20 has extended the opportunity to include a representative from Afghanistan, Pakistan and the MENA region. Selection is based on the applicant's responses to questions that focus on leadership, personal triumph and analytical skills and their ability to find innovative solutions to economic challenges both in their communities and globally.

"G(irls)20 cultivates future generations of female leaders through education and entrepreneurship," says Farah Mohamed, president, G(irls)20. "By collaborating with private and other social profit sector partners we are in a unique position to offer G20 Leaders with scalable solutions for the challenges they will be tackling next November in Australia, including: inclusive growth & employment, infrastructure and sustainability. The G(irls)20 Summit delegates are a resource the G20 Leaders can count on."

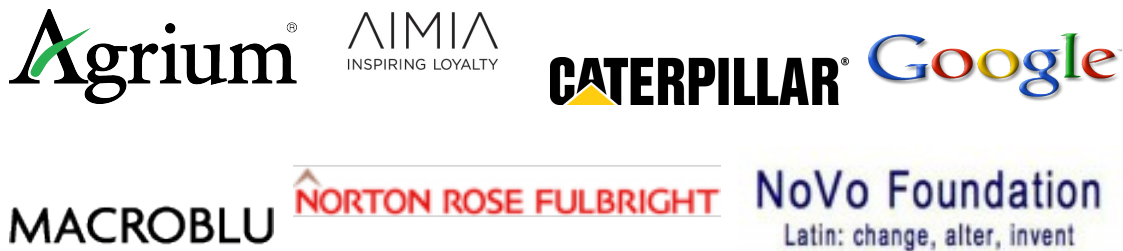
